

Game Day

For each game, bring:

- Emergency contact/liability forms for each player.
- Player passes, to be kept by the referees and returned to you after completion of the game
- Completed MYSA Official line up/Referee Report (form can be found at the MYSA website <http://mnyouthsoccer.org/publications/forms.cfm>.)
- First aid kit
- Match ball (the home team should supply the ball but sometimes cannot)
- Alternate jerseys (the home team should change in case of conflict but sometimes cannot)

For home games, also bring:

- Referee money in correct denominations so that each referee receives the proper amount in cash
- Referee Payment Verification form. Get referee signatures, verifying that they received the payment (<http://www.vusc.org> Documents -- VUSC)
- Stamped addressed envelope. The referee will mail the completed match reports to the age group leader responsible for your league. Labels will be provided to you at the MYSA mandatory coach's meeting.
- Corner flags

Playing up/Guest Players

- For any particular game, you may play with up to 3 guest players.
- Guest players need to be players from VUSC who are rostered on lower classification or lower age group teams. For example, if you are a U15C2 team, you may play with guest players from U15C3, U14C1, U14C2 or U14C3 team.

Some notes:

- A Premier player may only play up on a higher age group Premier team; they may not play up on a higher age group Classic team.
- Girls may play up on boy's teams, but boys may not play up on girl's teams.
- Any play-ups must first be communicated with the prospective player's coach. You must get that coach's permission before you contact the player and you will need to get the player pass from them (and return it safely).

Red Card Handling

- If one of your players is sent off during a game (receives a red card), it is your responsibility to have the referee complete the Ejected Participant Report. You will receive copies of this document at the coach's meeting or the form can be found at <http://mnyouthsoccer.org/publications/forms.cfm>.
- Once the required number of game suspension(s) are served, it is your responsibility to take the completed Ejected Participant Report to MYSA to retrieve their player pass.
